Noisy/Nuisance Neighbour Issue at Lamorrick - He has been in discussion with certain people locally. Sarah Dunden of Cornwall Council has insufficient details to take forward. He regularly hears abuse and loud blaring music. He is concerned that local people are going to take into their own hands soon. This person is just a liability. He also has concerns about this person even parking his car on other people's property and issues this could cause. Cornwall Councillor C. Batters appreciates all these comments but advised this situation is not easy to deal with. Chairman will visit Councillor A. Barnaby to establish where this person lives as he has been receiving a lot of emails recently, he would attend as a dispassionate attendee.</li> <li>2.
