210/21	<p>Monthly Cornwall Councillor Report:- Councillor Mrs. J. Cruse, reported as follows and thanked the Clerk for circulating prior to the meeting:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Update at Lamorrack flooding. I have taken this up with Highways and they tell me that this situation is a result of run off from build, so they will monitor this during the winter. In the meantime, I would urge residents to take footage and photos when problems arise. I have suggested this to the concerned residents. • Regarding the cutting back of verges I have made a report and I understand the area was inspected and not deemed to require action. I then raised a Casework regarding the state of the verges in general in Lanivet and the sentiment that residents were not happy. Additionally, I raised cases on flooding in Rectory Road, and cutting back laurel for local residents. • The roadworks is just about to start at last. Perhaps they will look at the verges and tidying up the area whilst working there. • As well as supporting the Panda Netball I have also supported the Beast Project which is soon to take place. Please check it out and support if you can. There are many activities, and these are open to the local schools to take part. It looks very exciting. The main organiser lives in Lanivet. https://www.cornwall-aonb.gov.uk/cornwall-aonb-events • Also, thanks to all who supported and worked towards the Tour of Britain. I was at the finish and attended the superb Priory Park event. It was a ray of sunshine in our rather restricted life. So good to see the warm and enthusiastic welcome given to the riders and the great atmosphere surrounding the whole event. • I have posted the link to the St Lawrence Masterplan on quite a few social media sites, with the expected reaction and many comments. We do need to encourage a good response to this. The consultation is open until the end of November so giving plenty of time to consider all aspects of this. • Pleased to see that a planning application to change from holiday letting to residential was passed after making written representation to the Planning Officer as originally the applicant was told it could not be determined due to the Camel SAC. • She reported the sludge is piped down to Nanstallon and in the 18 months it has increased. She is not sure if this is affecting Nanstallon with more traffic now. She would go to Nanstallon and visit residents if there are any concerns. Councillor Miss P. Bolton reported the traffic does not affect Nanstallon village itself. • Councillor A. Harris queried Cornwall Council Car Parks in Bodmin which are not working, and people are concerned they will get a parking ticket. Cornwall Councillor Mrs. J. Cruse confirmed she had been approached and apparently there has been a glitch and the machine was repaired but is still not working. It was noted none of the machines are working as of yesterday. <p>Chair thanked Cornwall Councillor Mrs. J. Cruse for her report this evening.</p>	
211/21	<p>Highway Issues/Footpath Issues/Damaged Signs in the Parish (Including Update on Bench Area damage near Six Turnings):-</p> <p>Highway Issues:- Councillor A. Barnaby reported the road into Lamorrack needs smoothing and planning since the potholes have been repaired. Chairman and Clerk confirmed these highway issues along with the pavement ones need to be reported online by Councillors Action: Councillors to action and Clerk to forward links for Cornwall Council Website.</p>	Cllrs/Clerk

	<p>Cornwall Councillor Mrs. J. Cruse reported on the drainage at Lamorick. A response had been received from Cormac advising it is known that significant volumes of water run down this hill during extreme or prolonged rainfall events, which is expected due to the very large catchment bringing surface water from surrounding saturated land which naturally travels downstream to the river. Unfortunately, there is little that can be done to prevent this due to the characteristics of the landscape in this area. However as mentioned previously approval for works to alter the existing concrete aprons surrounding the existing drains, to try and increase the surface water collected at a higher point up the hill. At the same time whilst the road is closed, they intend to carry out a CCTV survey to investigate and issues with the existing drainage line. They also continue to hold a drainage scheme designed in 2018 to make improvements to the outfall down at the bridge. Each year the scheme is prioritised against other sites requiring drainage improvements across the county. Whilst the flow down to the bridge at Lamorrick can be significant, they are not aware of any flooding to property, or major flooding of the highway following the extreme rainfall events we experienced last winter. If flooding does occur, residents need to ensure the details, including any supporting evidence (such as photographs and videos, and property details) are submitted to their team, so that they have up to date information in relation to local concerns.</p> <p>Footpaths:- Councillor C. Vercoe reported the pavement from Lamorrick to the village is very overgrown. Chairman reported he raised similar issues from St. Benets Abbey down through; this was actioned recently early hours of the morning. Chairman would like a discussion on pavement maintenance along Truro Road on whether the Parish Council take on to ensure the main footpaths through the centre of the village are kept clear. Councillor A. Barnaby advised that a lot of the growth is down to the landowners, Chairman agreed with this, and this was what Cornwall Council suggests. Councillor Miss P. Bolton suggested a Working Party and invite the local residents along these stretch of pavements through the village. It was resolved to invite Keats for a quote (Proposed: Councillor Miss P. Bolton; Councillor S. Jennings) with Councillors A. Barnaby and C. Vercoe meeting them on site to explain what is required. 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214/21	Lanivet Parish Affordable Housing Working Party Update from Chairman:- Chairman reported the CCLT have now moved offices from Truro to Redruth but there is no update on this project.	Clerk																																				
215/21	Lanivet Parish Sport & Recreation Trust Update:- Report received from Mr. D. Carter as follows:- <u>Firstly, the One For All Community Centre, Café and Training Room</u> Building work on the new café and training room is still making good progress, plastering of the external walls is almost complete, insulation material for the walls and floor has been delivered and installed. All pipes, manifolds and fitting for underfloor heating are now on site and it is hoped will be installed week beginning 13 th September. The next major item is the screeding of all the floors; this is scheduled to take place week beginning 27 th September. First fix electric will take place after floors have dried (just a few days). Although initially we had more than sufficient funds to complete the project, it is now becoming more difficult to keep up progress because of very high-cost increase on most materials. To get to the stage mentioned above we will have spent £90,000 that we have raised from various funders and our own reserves. We are keeping up a constant search for grants to complete the project and are currently awaiting results from applications, we have to appreciate that much funding went toward alleviating problems caused by the Covid pandemic and I think we have been fairly lucky with funding so far.
