

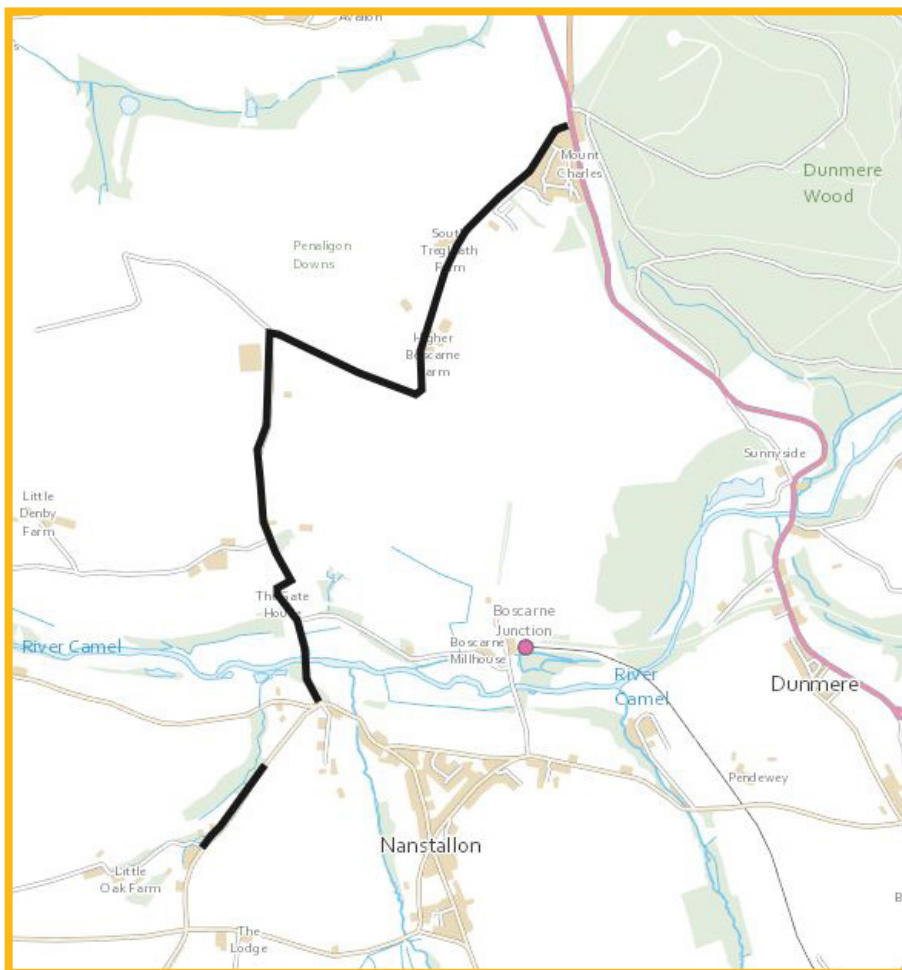
Highway maintenance schemes • October 2020

Nanstallon resurfacing and civil engineering works

As part of our maintenance activities a road closure will be in place off the A389 at Washaway towards Nanstallon from Monday 5 October to Friday 9 October while resurfacing works take place. A road closure will also be in place at Berry Lane from Monday 5 October to Friday 23 October while civil engineering works are carried out.

Works will be undertaken between the hours of 8.00am and 5.00pm.

We will have marshals on site to support residents and businesses needing local access. All through traffic will need to follow the diversions in place at all times.

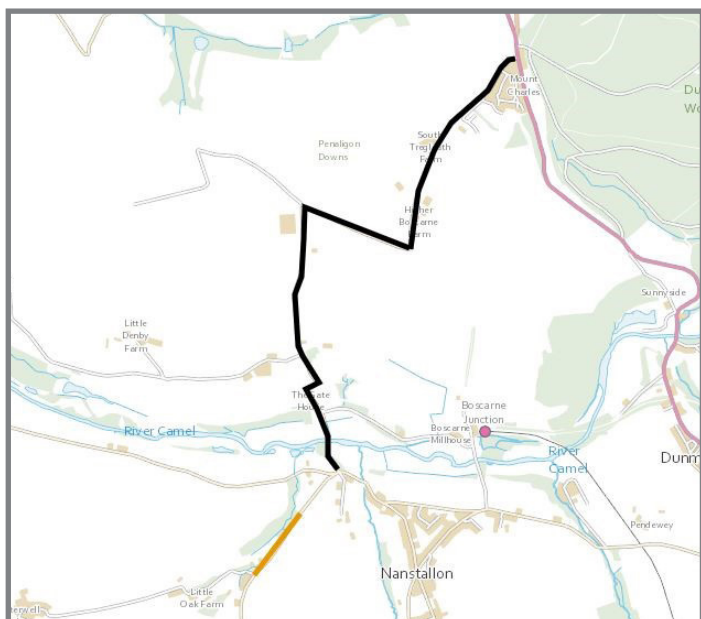

What works are taking place?

Resurfacing works will start on Monday 5 October and finish on Friday 9th October. Due to the width restrictions a full road closure is needed to ensure the works are completed safely.

We will also be carrying out ground investigation works on Berry Lane to determine the ground conditions, which will then feed into the design for the future strengthening of the retaining wall.

Trial holes will be dug on the retaining wall by hand, together with three dynamic probe holes. To enable this, a section of the road to the lower side of Berry Lane Farm will be closed for a period of up to three weeks from Monday 5 October to Friday 23 October.

Diversions

Signs will be placed at major junctions prior to the closure on the key routes to take non-through traffic away and keep traffic disruption to a minimum.

Diversion routes have to be suitable for the type of traffic that would normally use the route. We appreciate they can sometimes be quite lengthy, but in order to carry out the works safely to protect our operatives and road users we need to implement these measures.

Access arrangements

Access to residents and business will be maintained through gateways managed by traffic management marshals. Residents will need to stop at the closure gateways and will be given safety instructions such as speed limit restrictions prior to entering the closure.

During the civil engineering works, residents of Berry Lane will still be able to access their properties from the appropriate direction throughout, but there will be no vehicular through route.

Please be aware our resurfacing teams will access and exit the work site from the A389 at Washaway. As a result, there will be an increase in HGVs along this section and you may experience short delays while our teams need access or have to move machinery out of the way.

We will always do our best to accommodate day-to-day requirements of people affected by our works, and access will be maintained as much as possible for those people directly impacted by the closure.

Emergency access will be maintained at all times.

Working safely

Please be aware of the following hazards while the resurfacing is taking place.

- Uneven road surface where the old surface has been removed
- Raised manholes, gullies, and other service boxes
- Varying kerb heights when stepping off the footway

All our sites will be appropriately risk assessed and have strict safeguarding measures in line with current health and safety and Public Health England guidance to ensure the safety of residents and our staff.

Please be kind to the workforce and observe any signs or safety fencing that is in place. Our teams are working within the guidelines laid out by the government for construction works, and we are proud to be able to continue to keep on top of our commitments to improve road standards across the county.

Notifications

Resurfacing work is weather dependant and may be delayed by cold temperatures or heavy rain.

During the ongoing situation with COVID-19 we will continue to carry out our programmed resurfacing works while we have the available resource and material to do so.

However, if the situation changes it may result in works being postponed or cancelled at short notice and we will do our best to update the advance notice boards on our sites.
