Walking and cycling trails are becoming more and more popular. Locals and visitors alike find Cornwall to be the perfect location to stretch their legs and seek out our unique attractions. Some spiritually minded folk see this as an opportunity for pilgrimage; to find inspiration amidst the holy wells, Celtic crosses and ancient churches of our land.

The five churches of the Bodmin Team Ministry are looking to create a trail that will visit each of our churches in Lanivet, Lanhydrock, Cardinham, Bodmin and Nanstallon. As it stands, we are thinking of calling it **The Bodmin Way**. Both the Saints Way and the new Cornish Celtic Way pass through Lanivet. We believe we can tempt walkers to take a detour around our various churches. In the process they would pass by all the major tourist attractions in and around Bodmin: Lanhydrock House, Cardinham Woods, Bodmin and Wenford Steam Railway, Bodmin Regimental and Town Museums, Bodmin Jail and Camel Valley Vineyard. As well as walkers, we want to provide additional options to cyclists who come up the Camel Valley Trail, visit Lanhydrock or bounce around Cardinham Woods. If Bodmin is to become a major cycling centre, then a circular tour like this could be just the thing. In addition, it wouldn't be right just to think about the energetic outdoors types. A driving trail would offer everyone the chance to do something engaging for a day, particularly on the rare occasion when it rains

These tours could attract people in different ways. They might offer a heritage trail, with the churches presenting the histories of the various villages and town. They could offer a spiritual pilgrimage for the increasing numbers of people attracted to this experience. Indeed, St. Meubred's has already established itself as a cyclists and walkers church, with its cycle prayer station now well used. Plus they could provide an introduction to our countryside and wildlife.

As the trail would pass by all the Bodmin tourist attractions, the local economy would see a boost. Alongside the formal attractions lie the pubs, restaurants, B&Bs and hotels that would benefit from increased business. There would be opportunities in the churches for sale of goods, including guides, apps and keepsakes, plus payments for refreshments. Regular arts and cultural events could be organised in the churches.

Informed by the growing trend amongst village churches to offer 'champing' (Camping in Church), both Lanivet Church and St. Meubred's could be adapted to provide some basic walkers overnight accommodation. This would require investment for toilet, kitchen and bunking provision.

This concept raises a number of opportunities for the village. One is to see your church used more regularly by visitors and locals alike, and to generate new streams of income to help preserve this wonderful building. Another opportunity is to bring together the history of the village into presentations in church. Local residents will have photos and stories to share. These could be presented in a professional and engaging way for posterity. Finally, there is the benefit of bringing visitors into the village to help sustain and develop its economy.

#### Garden Jottings

Going through my garden diary for last year it informed me that it was mild and damp! Well to my mind this year it has been exceedingly wet to the point of flooded roads and fields followed by the 'Beast from the East' which ensured my outside thermometer never rose above freezing for days on end. This was followed by a fair covering of snow which seemed to last forever; in fact when travelling on the A30 regularly the snow was still visible for well over a week across Bodmin Moor.

I visited the Spring Flower Show at RHS Rosemoor in early March and yet there was still road signs out warning of snow! If anyone is interested in viewing displays of spring flowers in all their glory then this should be show not to miss in the future. The scent wafting from the hall when they opened the doors for visitors was phenomenal

The severe frosts didn't damage my snowdrops I'm pleased to say and they were back up with their nodding heads soon after the cold spell. The weather certainly did curtail my gardening regime and lots of jobs had to be put on the back-burner, however weeding is now in fall flow. As they say a few hours weeding at this time of the years saves days of laborious weeding later in the season when everything has taken hold.

Late April is a good time if the weather is mild to plant up your hanging baskets and hang them in the greenhouse of lean-to, this helps give them a major start to put on a fabulous summer display before hardening them off for being outside. Do not forget to use slow release fertiliser and water-retaining gel.

If you are into sweet peas then you can sow the seed outdoors now and If you have previously sown seed then now is the time to plant them out. At the same time you can erect your 'wigwam' canes for them to climb when they are established. Even into May do be aware and check the weather forecast for late frosts if you do grow sensitive plants or shrubs, just remember to use a covering of fleece to protect them. I use clothes pegs to keep the fleece in place, if a hard frost is expected either use several layers of fleece or if potted plants move to a protected area away from frost pockets.

Now I find is a good time to spread a mulch around those shrubs and herbaceous border plants which will help suppress the weeds. I use my own composted leaf mulch which is ideal for covering the soil and looks good as well. Now is the time to also prune out any damaged stems to your plants and shrubs; I remove lower branch of my evergreens to enable light to reach the flower beds beneath which may have become devoid of light and become overgrown.

Vegetable growing really takes off in April. After all the risk of frosts have gone the veg plot can be put into action. Hardened off vegetables such as tomatoes and courgettes can be planted up. Previously chitted second early potatoes should be ready to be planted out early April followed by main crop varieties from late April; all depending on weather of course. Happy gardening.

Well, what weather have we experienced over the past weeks! Torrential rain to snow and back to rain!!

The torrential rain we had, which seemed to be non-stop, had me expecting loads of telephone calls from residents

of the seven parishes I cover with drainage issues and the like, but amazingly I only had two calls in total, both from Lanivet!

This past weekend saw severe flooding on Friday night at Lamorrick, with water cascading down from the top of the hill carry much debris along with it, and bad flooding down by the bridge, and at the end of Woodland Glade a garden was badly flooded from water cascading down from the rear of the property. Both of these issues were reported and working with your Parish Chairman,

we shall be pushing for preventative measures to be carried out on each.

If anyone, during their travels through the parish, sees any drain or gully that is blocked, whereby rain water cannot escape down it, then feel free to contact me and I will get it attended to. Early cleaning of the drainage systems can of course avoid the problems of flooding later.

Pot Holes is another problem that regularly surfaces. Can I ask again if anyone driving through the parish sees any pothole that requires attention, then again please contact me straight away and I will ensure it is attended to and repaired, usually within forty-eight hours of the report. I've noticed a couple of times recently when I have driven through my seven parishes, I've come across really deep potholes, and when I have spoken to any locals they tell me the hole has been there for a week or so!!!

Please, please, if you find a pot hole, let me know, preferably by email with an exact location, but whatever, please contact me.

If it's left unattended, it nearly always leads to someone, possibly one of your friends, having their car damaged in one way or another.

The new budget for Cornwall Council and Council Tax has now been agreed and accepted, and if there is anyone seeking answers to questions they may have on the budget, do feel free to ring me direct and I will outline the reasons for whatever decisions have been taken. I have always believed such questions are better answered one-to-one rather than emails flying to and fro. A personal answer is by far still the easiest and quickest.

I cannot let this magazine edition pass without making a comment on the new Community.

I cannot let this magazine edition pass without making a comment on the new Community Centre in Lanivet. The residents of Lanivet and surrounding areas should feel proud to have such an excellent facility in their village. #### LETTER FROM THE CHAIRMAN LANIVET PARISH COUNCIL

Much has been reported to us recently about the traffic and parking issues around Lanivet. This has been an on-going problem since I became a Councillor about 9 years ago and the Parish Councillors have spent many hours attending meetings with other agencies, including, the School, Cormac, The Police, Cornwall Council Highways, our Cornwall Councillor and others.

Truro Road seems to be one major concern. We did get Cornwall Council to monitor the speed and amount of traffic over a two week period last summer, which showed that the majority of traffic was, in fact, not exceeding the speed limit and the traffic flow was such that there was plenty of time for people to cross the road safely between vehicles. According to their experts it would not justify the cost of, or the need for, a crossing. especially as they had recently enhanced the pedestrian islands.

We have recently had discussions with Cornwall Council about the possibility of a crossing or installing speed cameras if we could find a way of funding them. but we have been advised that, as cameras cannot be installed and run by anybody other than Cornwall Council, that would not be possible The cost of a crossing would be between £70k and £120k. Always supposing that another traffic survey, at a cost to us of £680 supported the need.

Another discussion we have had with Highways, is about Lamorrick corner and we are exploring the cost and possibilities of extending the 30mph limit and improving the signage in that area. this could possibly be paid for in part by crowd funding or grants

Some Councillors did try to get a Speed Watch group established but unfortunately by the time the Police got around to processing the paperwork, (this took about two years), most of the volunteers had lost interest or died.

The other major concern is about the parking problems around the school, again this is something that has been ongoing for many years, and we had hoped that the opening of the new carpark, the path across the green and the offer of parents using the pub and fish and chip shop carparks would stop most of these problems, Sadly that doesn't seem to be the case.

We have tried many different ideas including. Asking Cornwall Council to install yellow lines. This we were told is not possible, as they can't justify the cost and they don't have enough enforcement officers to enforce them anyway. We have asked the police for their help. But with their own financial and staffing constraints this has proved to be somewhat limited. The school have done what they can, asking parents to be responsible, getting the staff to use the carpark etc. But as the previous head pointed out to me, their responsibility actually ends at the school gate. We even borrowed some no parking cones and put them out ourselves for a trial period, but unfortunately some were stolen, and others destroyed.

We will be putting up some more signage soon, paid for by our Cornwall Councillor Chris Batters. Out of the Community Chest Fund, around the new carpark, advising drivers to be aware of people crossing. We are also looking at a new scheme that allows parishes to employ Cornwall Council parking enforcement officers, at a cost to us of £30 per hour. But obviously this would have to be paid for out of the precept.

Please be assured that the Parish Council takes these issues seriously and looks at them monthly and we do try to explore any other avenues open to us. Steve Walker Chairman Lanivet Parish Council
